Warren County Transit provides neighboring bus/public transportation services at convenient, low cost on demand, curb to curb, for anyone in Warren County regardless of age or income. It serves our Warren County community and is beneficial for elderly individuals who are independent but unable to drive.

These buses are funded by the Warren County Commissioners; however, they are operated by an outside agency. In the past, the driver's only means of communication was radio. The Transit radios have been set up by TELECOM to include interoperability talkgroups.

In January 2024, WC transit has a new outside agency managing the service. With this service, they will use computers for communication and dispatching.

TELECOM has worked with the new company to retain the radios for emergency situations. Telecom will continue to provide service for the radios so they will retain the interoperability channels.



#### DID YOU KNOW ~ "WHY DOES MY RADIO BONK?"

#### Listed below are some of reasons why:

- The number one reason is you are probably trying to talk at the same time as someone else. Quick keying after someone has stopped talking is the most likely.
- Tailgating, or being to close to someone else's transmission will cause a bonk. Quick keying after a dispatcher's transmission using a M.C.C. radio console will not bonk.
- You're inside a building or located in an area with poor radio coverage.
- Your vehicle antenna is loose, broken, or missing.
- Your portable radio doesn't have the correct antenna, or it is loose.
- If the system is busy. This typically only occurs when we are in a big storm, snow-storm during rush hour, or other large incident affecting many agencies. The radio will bonk 3 times for a busy and then beep you back (dit, dit, dit) when you have a clear channel assigned to you letting you to "key now".

#### WINDOWS and MOBILE DATA COMPUTERS/LAPTOPS

It is time to start thinking about Mobile Data Computer/MDC (MDC – any mobile device with a Windows OS (operating system) that connects to the PSN (Public Safety Network) via VPN (Netmotion)) and their future with the upcoming Windows 11. The end date for Telecom's use of Windows 10 will be July 31, 2025. We will not begin Windows 11 installation until 2025. With Windows 11, there are restrictions coming from Microsoft that cannot be upgraded on existing hardware.

As it stands, the CF-19, CF-31, CF-20 MK 1, CF33-MK 1, and the G1 are not supported by the Windows 11 processor requirement. Current models that support upgrading to Windows 11 are CF-20 Mk2, CF-33 Mk2 FZ-55, G2 Surface pro's 6, 7, 8. I will be following up with individual department emails containing MDC lists of what is and isn't supported.
